

Bryson ISD Farm Policy

The Bryson ISD School Farm is provided by the school district as an opportunity for students to learn life lessons and skills through the raising of livestock projects. The farm is a luxury for FFA members that choose to utilize it. Keeping a project at the school farm is a privilege, not a right. Like all things in life, there are rules and regulations to follow. If any of these are abused or neglected, the members' privileges can be taken away. All school policies and state laws will govern the school farm.

Rules

1. All BISS policies will be observed at all times.
2. Any member may have his/her animal evicted from the school farm if rules are not followed.
3. Rules apply to any person at the farm be it members, parents, or guest.
4. Guest of members is only to be present with members.
5. No one may be in possession or consuming alcohol while on school grounds.
6. Members are to keep their area clean at all times. The condition of each individual's pen affects the health of all animals in the barn.
7. Store equipment in proper designated area at all times.
8. All trash and waste is to be taken care of immediately. Use the trash cans, and if they are full, empty them into dumpster outside of barn.
9. Be courteous of others and respectful of their animals.
10. Never feed or medicate anyone's animal unless specifically asked to.
11. If you suspect neglect or abuse of an animal let Mr. Edwards know as soon as possible.
12. One animal will be allowed per pen, unless prior approval is granted.
13. All bedding is to be approved by Mr. Edwards prior to use. We will not allow Straw bedding.
14. Pen Rent will be \$35. This covers all medications, water, shelter, panel and electricity cost for the farm.
15. Each individual is responsible for proper dismantle and clean up of his or her area after the sale of their project.
16. All projects are to be removed from the barn by the first weekend of spring break, unless prior arrangements have been made with Mr. Edwards.
17. The Agriculture Science Department, Bryson FFA, Bryson ISD, are not responsible for any loss or damage to any person, property, or livestock which may occur at the school farm or on any trip which pertains to students projects.
18. All Students must stay in contact with AGSC teacher to keep informed with events and changes to with projects.
19. All students will be required to maintain an accurate FFA record book of all expenses dealing with their project.
20. The Ag Sc department reserves the right to make decisions concerning the school farm, rules, and projects at the school farm.

Consequences

Any Student that does not abide by the rules of the school farm will be subject to the following disciplinary action by the teacher.

1st offense: Verbal Warning

2nd offense: Parental and Administrator Contact & Disciplinary Action

3rd offense: Eviction of project & disciplinary action
