 - Daily during teacher conference period times which will be posted on the school website.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
 - If state guidelines permit family engagement events will be executed to encourage parent-child breakfasts at school to start the day and for adults to stay and observe or volunteer in their child's classes.
